The Master of Public Health in Epidemiology will prepare you to design epidemiologic studies, lead outbreak investigations, perform statistical analyses, and understand the biological principles underlying both infectious and chronic diseases. You will utilize your training to conduct epidemiologic research studies by collecting, analyzing, and interpreting data that is used to develop evidence-based practices.

Our faculty are actively involved in the following areas: environmental and occupational epidemiology, cancer, chronic disease, infectious disease, genetic and molecular epidemiology, and veterinary epidemiology. As a ColoradoSPH student, you will also have access to epidemiology faculty and resources at both the Colorado State University and the University of Colorado Anschutz Medical campuses.
