¹To be eligible for financial aid for the undergraduate dietetic courses, students will start out enrolled as a 2nd bachelor's student through either the Food Science and Human Nutrition department or the Human Development and Family Studies department. Students need to be enrolled in at least ## credits to be eligible for financial aid in those terms. For these terms financial aid is processed through Colorado State University.

²Once the undergraduate dietetic courses are complete the student will transition to the Master of Public Health program. For these terms financial aid is processed through the CU Denver Anschutz Medical Campus, which is the administrative center for the Colorado School of Public Health.

³While students are completing their dietetic internship they will be placed on administrative Leave of Absence (LOA) in the ColoradoSPH to maintain their active student status while they are not registered for courses.

⁴Students could potentially graduate during the Spring 3 term if their practicum and capstone project are completed through the dietetic internship, and the student presents their capstone project during the Spring 3 term.
